Lelia Duley has been an Associate Trustee of CLL Support since September 2020. She is Emeritus Professor of Clinical trials at Nottingham University and was Professor of Obstetric Epidemiology at the University of Leeds from 2006-11. The three key areas of experience and expertise Lelia has brought as an Associate Trustee of CLL Support are: 1) her clinical background as a doctor: throughout her career she has worked closely with NHS clinicians, patients and patient representatives; 2) 30 years' experience as a clinical researcher working on multicentre randomised trials and systematic reviews across a range of clinical specialities; 3) nearly 15 years' experience of living with CLL, including having FCR as first line treatment and participating in the CLARITY trial (a single arm study of ibrutinib plus venetoclax) after relapse. Following her retirement Lelia became the patient representative on the study team running the FLAIR trial and is now involved in that role in other clinical trials, including STATIC. She is very keen to ensure there is a strong voice representing the interests of CLL patients and is an enthusiastic advocate of effective communication with patients. As part of that she has prepared plain English summaries of the results of several trials relating to the treatment of people with CLL.
